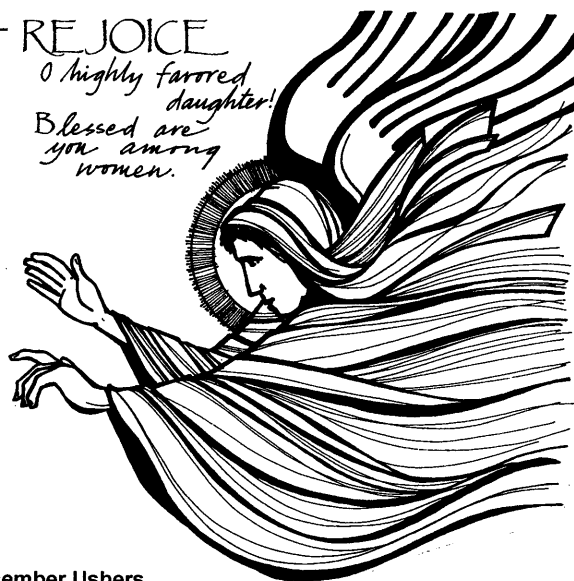

Monday, Jan 1, 2018 is the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. As it falls on a Monday, it is not a holy day of obligation. There will be Mass at Granville @ 9 am. (Holy Hour to follow).

Hour of Prayer: After the 9 am Mass at Granville on New Year's Day, there will be exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, followed by a Scriptural Rosary and silent adoration. Benediction will take place at 10:30 am. Join in all or part of this time praying in a special way for peace in the new year.

Vocation View: Rejoice, never cease praying. Let us never cease praying for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life (1 Thes. 5:16-24)

Holy Communion \ Exchange of Peace at Mass: Due to the increase of flu during these winter months, Holy Communion will be offered only under the form of Sacred Bread. As to the ministry of Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, when Deacon Dan is present, one EMHC will be scheduled to assist at Mass; when Deacon is not present, two EMHCs will be scheduled to help with distribution of the Sacred Host. Until further notice, we will also refrain from exchanging the sign of peace. This will go into effect the weekend of December 30 \ 31.

Alton EMHCs: In regard to homebound \ Nursing Home visits, thanks for responding to the survey. In considering the responses, it seems best to continue on as in the past -- that is, to make the visits on Saturday or Sunday. For the most part, the weekend Mass times don't lend to consistently make the visits after the scheduled weekend Mass, so the dismissal prayer at Mass will be discontinued. Those who will be making visits after Mass, kindly come to sacristy \ sanctuary after Mass to attain the Eucharist. A few reminders...the Eucharist may only be carried to the sick or homebound in a pyx. It is never to be carried in any other container. such as a handkerchief, envelope, etc. Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion must take the Eucharist directly from the church to the individuals who are to receive. The Eucharist must never be taken home overnight to be distributed to the sick the next day, and must never be kept in one's vehicle nor anywhere else but a tabernacle. On a related note, in checking with the staff and residents of the Nursing Home, Friday is also a viable day to bring the Eucharist to the Catholic residents.... should that be better for schedule of EMHC who make the visits. The weekly list of names of those to visit will be on the sacristy counter with a prayer to be used for the visits. Thank you, -Fr. Greving
